

BSNR Education Fellow

Applications are encouraged for this new voluntary post associated with the BSNR Training and Educational Subcommittee. This is for a trainee at the ST3+ level who is undergoing or plans to undergo neuroradiology subspecialty training and has an interest in medical education.

The BSNR Training and Education Subcommittee (TESC) have been organising a national neuroradiology training programme, and our aim is to make this more accessible and aligned with the RCR curriculum. We have previously produced a curriculum support tool, but this requires updating and redesigning for the current educational output (including the pacsbin case library), and we hope to integrate this into the website.

The role would include (but not be limited to):

- Attending the TESC meetings (approximately 4-6/year, predominantly virtual)
- Collating and designing a new curriculum support tool (with supervision)
- Liaising with the Junior Representatives to incorporate trainee perspectives
- Providing input into design of future BSNR educational activities

The fellow may also wish to design and implement educational social media strategies with the support of the committee, although this is not essential. There may be an opportunity to present or publish the work done as part of this fellowship.

This is a fixed post for one year, although there may be the opportunity to continue as part of the committee following the completion of the year.
